You can find us in the social media such as TikTok, Instagram and SnapChat, that you should start to follow. We will make sure that Eldis will be the best camp ever!



Program at Eldis 22

The first afternoon and evening of the camp will be enjoyed at the Get Together Festival, which features music and a variety of program numbers! The atmosphere of the festival is enhanced by the small candy and snack stalls in the area.

In the evenings, you can experience the heights of working in the Fall Hazardous Area (PVAT) or challenge your friends to fun-filled competitions and games. If you want to be quieter, you can find it in the living room of the circus tent. The living room also has the opportunity to meet adults and exchange ideas with them.

On the visitday at Wednesday, the Finnish champions of the stirrup pump competitions will be decided, and on Tuesday evening the winners of the women's SM-lines competition will be decided. We will announce more about the competition schedules as the schedules become more precise, so you should stay tuned!

All camp-participants will receive a public transport ticket for the Helsinki region. The public transport ticket allows for small trips in Helsinki in the AB zone in the evenings between your own fire brigade. This will also allow those travelling further afield to explore the capital's attractions! The camp's own travel agency offers pre-planned excursion options. On Thursday and Friday nights, however, it's worth staying in the campground, as that's when the circus tent turns into a big disco where the sound, light and atmosphere are top notch! On the last night of the camp, Friday, we will hold the final circus of the camp, where the program will feature circus art, music and atmosphere at the top. What a great ending to a wonderful camp week!


During the camp week, there will be an opportunity to get acquainted with the CTIF fire department competition activities and get to test the CTIF race track and the charm of the pace. We have heard rumors that international camp guests may challenge Finns to try out the race track - will you accept the challenge?

Camp safety informs!

All participants of the camp will have a bracelet in different colors depending on your task. The bracelet functions also as a tag and you will be able to pay with it.

The camp area is itself in the middle of the runaways. The accommodation area is at the opposite direction with the education area. In the middle of those two is the center of the camp where you can find the duty areas of the security, camp hospital and camp fire station. The whole camp area is surrounded by a fence, entrance in and out of the camp happens through controlled gates.





The camp has its own covid-19 group that follows national directions. The camp follows directions from the Finnish institute for health and welfare. Current restrictions will be communicated in the camps social media as well at the camps websites, so please follow those actively.

The camp is an event of joy. Occasionally, however, accidents may happen and it's important to be prepared for them. Please note that the Eldis 22 camp does not ensure the participants, so it is a good idea for each participant to have either a fire department or their own insurance against possible accidents.

The camp maintenance

The maintenance of the camp has a great responsibility. They are in charge of the water and electricity service to the camp. That's why they need a lot of help. There will be a construction camp and for that, they need all available adults.

The construction camp will start on Wednesday 29.6.2022 and they will build everything that's needed to the actual camp. After the real camp there will be a demolition camp that will start on Saturday 9.7.2022 and will end at the 12.7.2022. At the demolition camp the Malmi Airport will put to its normal appearance as it was before the camp.

Those who arrives to the construction and/or demolition camp will have an opportunity to stay overnight and have meals. That's why you need to sign up for them both. You don't need to attend the "real camp" you can also just attend the construction and /or the demolition camp.


At the camp there are several containers with drinking water where you can fill you water bottle. There will also be containers with water where you can wash your hands. The containers will be properly marked.


During the week you can wash yourself with warm water at the shower containers. It's about 500 m from the camp area to the showers. There are individual showers for boys, girls and other genders. This year there are now possibility to have a swim or sauna at the camp area. There won't be any watertoilets at the camp, instead there are a lot of so called BajaMajas.

The maintenance is also in charge of the garbage disposal. We hope that you help us keep your tent and the whole tent area clean off garbage.

Transportation

The movement from one place to another in the camp area takes place by foot. Only adult staff are allowed to use a bicycle or non-motorized vehicle to travel around the camp.





Caravan park

A caravan place without electricity costs 30 € / week and with electricity 50 € / week. The caravan place is paid at the camp to the canteen. In addition to the fee, a camp fee of 170 € / camper must be paid. There is no opportunity for a fixed water connection or drainage of the septic tank in the caravan area, but there is a drinking water point for carrier water and also BajaMajas. The caravan park is part of the campsite, and the camp rules and conditions of participation apply equally in the area.

Kitchen

Every day serves four meals; breakfast, lunch, dinner and supper. The distribution of food takes place in several numbered lines. After you get your numbered line, you will use the same line through the whole camp. The idea is to be able to take into account the different age groups in this way.

All campers need to have their own cutlery. The bowl should be solid, deep, tough and plastic or enameled. The cup should have a handle so that it's easier to pour hot drinks in it. After the meal you wash your own cutlery at the wash-place. Remember to take a towel with you so that you can dry your cutlery.

Cafeteria services

The canteen Café Kipinä, at the camp is open every day from 6:30 – 22:00. The containers and ice cream trailers are open from 7:00 –21:00. All that you need you'll be able to find from the camp cafeteria assortment and we promise that the doughnuts won't run out!


Office

The camp office serves the campers even before the camp, e.g., with registrations, tent surveys, billing and more. The tasks of the camp office also include arranging arrival at the camp together with security, information services during the camp and e.g., camp certificates. During the camp, the staff bank operating in connection with the office will divide the tasks into different industries according to needs.

Communication greetings

The Eldis 22 camp depicts images and video material for communication and marketing use of the camp and youth activities, for example on the social media channels and websites of the camp. At Eldis, a lot of information is also transmitted digitally, and we produce various functions and programs mobile. The purpose of digital services and the program is to enliven the camp. The use of a telephone at the camp is not mandatory, but we recognize that almost all campers have one with them. Please note that the camp will not replace any equipment breakdowns, so be careful when using the telephone. The camp has unattended charging points and campers are encouraged to bring back-up power supplies.

A lot of the information is passed on digitally at the Eldis camp. We also attend to produce various activities and programs mobile. Our thought is to brighten the camp with digital service and program. It's not mandatory to use your own mobile phone, but we recognize, that almost everybody has got their own mobile with them to the camp. Notice, that the camp does not replace damages to the mobile phone, so please be careful. There will be unsupervised charging places and we recommend that campers take power banks with them to the camp.


Translation services


The main international language for the camp is English. If you need help with another language, you can find the contact info for translators at every office and at the cafeteria.

Security adult greetings

For the first time ever this year, there will also be specially designated security adults at the camp. Their role is to advise, support and assist campers in confidence in a variety of situations involving bullying, harassment, or discrimination. Safety adults are present and available throughout the camp and can be caught either by jerking the sleeve or by phone. The telephone number for safety adults will be posted at the camp.

The job description and name of the security adult have been discussed and worked together with, among others, scouts who have had a similar task as part of their scouting activities for a long time.
